WEST STEWARTSTOWN – Albert E. Barnes, 87, of Pittsburg, passed away at the Coös County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown early on Thursday afternoon, March 5, 2020, after a long period of declining health.

He was born in Alton, NH, on Aug. 2, 1932, a son to the late Charles R. and Christine (Harris) Barnes. He grew up in Alton and was a graduate of Alton High School.

For most of his adult life, Albert worked as a carpenter alongside his father. He also worked for almost 30 years as a part-time police officer for the Town of Alton, and he was also a deputy sheriff for Belknap County for a period of time. Albert loved to ski and snowshoes, and he also enjoyed hunting and fishing which was what brought him to live in Pittsburg upon his retirement. Albert was a longtime member of Winnepesaukee Lodge #75, F. & A.M. in Alton.
