COLEBROOK – On Thursday, Jan. 20, 2022, Cynthia Hartlen, 75, loving mother and friend, passed away at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital after a brief illness, surrounded by family.

Cynthia was born on Sept. 23, 1946, to Clement and Mary (Cummings) Gleason. She was known for her independence especially when it came to using that woodstove every winter (and sometimes summer). She loved her family very much and enjoyed spending time with them.

She is survived by her son, Eric Hartlen, and his wife Pam, daughter Laurie Daley and her husband Michael Daley, and partner, Freeman Hartlen. She has 2 grandchildren, Krista Reid, husband Emmett and Sierra Cotnoir, husband Angelo Cordero and great

granddaughter Alannah Reid. She has 6 step-grandchildren and many step great grandchildren. She leaves behind nieces and nephews and many wonderful friends and neighbors.
