



David Edwin Lewis

April 28, 1931 - October 16, 2021

COLEBROOK – David Edwin “Eddie” Lewis, 90, of Colebrook, passed away at his home on Saturday, Oct. 16, 2021, after a long period of declining health.

Ed was born in Colebrook on April 28, 1931, a son to the late Charles J. and Sophia R. (Slowick) Lewis, Sr. He was raised and educated in Colebrook, was a graduate of the Class of 1949 from Colebrook Academy, and later attended the U.S. Naval Academy, graduating in 1954. He later attended the post-graduate studies at the Naval College in Monterey, Calif., obtaining a degree in communications engineering.

Eddie’s naval career spanned more than 25 years, and he retired in 1979 at the rank of Commander. His career took him all over the world, and he was wounded aboard the U.S.S. Liberty in the Mediterranean Sea when the nation of Israel attacked the ship, claiming a mistaken identification of the ship. For the rest of his life, Eddie bore the scars of that day, and he was deeply involved with the group of survivors, proving that the state of Israel and the Johnson administration deliberately staged the attack to try and draw the U.S. into the Israeli-Egyptian Six-Day War in 1967. In 2018, he was a central figure and collaborator in the book “Blood In the Water” which chronicles this dark episode of American military history.

Eddie also was a proud member of the Free & Accepted Masons and was a 50+-year member and Past Master of Evening Star Lodge #37 in Colebrook. He also held many other positions and memberships in many other appendant Masonic bodies, both locally and nationally. Eddie was also a life-long and faithful member of the Monadnock Congregational Church.

He leaves behind his wife, Dolores (LaCasse) Lewis of Colebrook; two sons, Michael C. Lewis and wife Paula of Chesapeake, Va., and Christopher J. Lewis and wife Wanda of Minneapolis, Minn.; a brother, Palmer Lewis and wife Ruth of Colebrook; a sister, Lynda Biron and husband James of Colebrook; six grandchildren, Keith, Benjamin, Johnny, Seth, Peter and Abby; as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

Eddie is predeceased by three brothers, Harold S. Lewis, Darwin "Buddy" Lewis and Charles J. Lewis, Jr., and a sister, Patricia Ann Lewis.

Calling hours will be on Thursday, Oct. 21, 2021, from 6 to 8 p.m. at the Jenkins & Newman Funeral Home in Colebrook. A Masonic Lodge of Sorrow will immediately precede the visitation at the funeral home at 5:45. A funeral service will be held the next morning, Friday, Oct. 22, at 11 a.m. at the Monadnock Congregational Church in Colebrook. Interment will be private in the Colebrook Village Cemetery.

“ I only knew Eddie Lewis for less than two months, from August 21, 2021 to the last time that I spoke with him on October 15, 2021, the day before this great man passed away. We became great friends, although we spoke on the phone maybe 7 times. I knew Eddie as "Dave Lewis" as he let me call him or "Commander Lewis." Up until the day he died, Eddie told me you can call me any day if you want to and he was graciously to answer any question I had about the USS Liberty. Eddie felt obligated to tell everyone the truth about the USS Liberty - which is that both President Lyndon Johnson and Israel conspired to sink that ship so they could blame it on Egypt. It was one of the most heinous crimes in American history and Eddie or "Dave" Lewis (as I knew him) felt obligated, on behalf of his courageous, fallen and wounded shipmates to tell the truth about that matter until his last living breath. Eddie Lewis told me that there will not be justice in this case until it is recognized that Lyndon Johnson personally was involved in the attempted sinking of the USS Liberty and the murder of everyone on board.

I told Eddie on October 15, 2021, don't you worry, Ernie Gallo (of the USS Liberty) and everyone else will tell the truth about what happened that day. Eddie's work in Joan Mellen's book Blood in the Water will be remembered as historical truth forever. Eddie's interviews for the 2021 documentary "Sacrificing Liberty" will be remembered forever as historical truth.

Eddie Lewis had a crystal clear mind until the end of his life. He was funny and had a sense of humor and he was a sharp analyst in what actually happened with the USS Liberty. Eddie also told me he used to run a community garden for his town, when he was younger, on about an acre of land.

Eddie also told me he loved his grandchildren very much and was looking forward to seeing them one last time.

We have lost a great, honorable, decent man in David Edwin Lewis, but he will definitely be remembered.
