WEST STEWARTSTOWN – Theresa Merrill, 92, of West Stewartstown, passed away on Wednesday, Jan. 22, 2020, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook after a long period of declining health.

She was born in Canaan, Vt., on Nov. 27, 1927, the daughter of the late Arthur and Rose (Benoit) Lanctot. She was raised in Beecher Falls and attended St. Albert School.

After her marriage to Kedric Merrill of Pittsburg in 1946, Theresa and her husband lived for over 30 years in California. While he was in the aviation industry, Theresa was a baker in the culinary department at a San Diego hospital. They retired to Florida in 1993, and enjoyed touring the entire continental U.S. in their motorhome.

Theresa is preceded in death by her husband of 69 years, Kedric Merrill in 2015, by a son, David, as an infant, 10 brothers and 4 sisters.
