COLEBROOK – Alan W. Wright, 93, passed away at his home in Colebrook on Wednesday, Feb. 1, 2023.

He was born in Malden, Mass., on July 19, 1929, a son to the late Melvin and Esther (Small) Wright. He was raised in Malden and was a graduate of Malden High School, Class of 1945. He later attended the Milwaukee School of Engineering for two years and became certified as an HVAC technician.

Al then returned to N.H. and lived in Chichester and Pembroke for many years. He was the owner and operator of Profile Electronics until 2010, with operations in Bow and Gorham. His camp in Colebrook became his home after retirement which he loved.

Al loved music, and was an accomplished organist and pianist. He was one of the organists for the Trinity United Methodist Church in Colebrook. He was also a motorcycle enthusiast, and rode until the age of 90. He and his wife enjoyed many motorcycle trips as long-time members of the Granite State Riders. He also enjoyed snowmobiling, boating, and many other pursuits. To say that Al was active throughout his life would be an understatement.

His faith was also very important to him and he was a faithful member of the Methodist Church. He was also a long-time Master Mason as a member of the

Free & Accepted Masons.

Alan leaves behind his two sons, Mark and Robert, both of Colebrook, and a granddaughter. He is predeceased by his wife, Virginia (Roberts) Wright, a son, Thomas, and two siblings, Donald Wright and Muriel Saunders.
