LEMINGTON – Albert Bunnell, 84, of Lemington, Vt., passed away on Monday, Nov. 9, 2020, at the Coos County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown.

He was born in Lewiston, Me., on Dec. 20, 1935. He was the beloved husband of the late Carol (Uran) Bunnell; father of Susan (Kenneth) and Steven (Rebecca) ; and grandfather of Louise, Adam, Jesse, Kyle and Sadie.

For many years, Al was involved with emergency medical services in Colebrook and was an EMT instructor with his wife, Carol. In his later years, he was called to ministry in the Methodist Church and was a pastor in Whitefield.
