



## Albert J. Mercauto

WEST STEWARTSTOWN, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Albert J. Mercauto, 71, of West Stewartstown, New Hampshire, passed away suddenly early Tuesday morning, January 15, 2008, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital.
