COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE -- Mr. Alcide Beloin, 84, of Colebrook, New Hampshire, passed away in the late evening on Saturday, January 27, 2007, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital, with his loving family by his side. Mr. Beloin was born June 19, 1922, in East Hereford, Québec, son of the late Emmaneul Beloin and Rosa (Adam) Beloin. Mr. Beloin attended schools in Hereford, but also worked on the family farm as a youngster. He was an award-winning dairy farmer on Hall Stream for 36 years, and he was known throughout New England for the quality of his milk products, receiving recognition many times from the United Farmers. He also worked as a logger and Christmas tree farmer, putting in ten years making wreaths and garland roping for the Marchesseault tree farm. Before retiring, Mr. Beloin worked for a time in the operations and maintenance department for Ethan Allen Furniture in Beecher Falls, as well. He was a life member of the Knights of Columbus and a communicant at St. Albert's Parish and St. Brendan's Catholic Church in Colebrook. He will be missed by many, and will be remembered as a very loving husband, father, brother, grandfather, uncle, cousin and friend. Mr. Beloin leaves behind his wife of 58 years, Mrs. Yvette (Maurais) Beloin of Colebrook; three daughters, Suzanne Carrier of Colebrook, Colette Bellows and husband, Carl, of Lancaster, NH, and Leona Beloin of The Colony, Tx.; two sons, Pierre Beloin and wife, Tracy, of Rosemeade, Calif., and Guy Beloin and wife, Frances, of Litchfield, NH; five brothers, Eugene Beloin and wife, Marie, of Colebrook, Gerard Beloin and
