Mr. Tony Hebert, 92, of Bloomfield, Vermont, passed away Monday, September 13, 2004, in Bloomfield.

Tony was born February 9, 1912, in St. Edwidge, Quebec, as one of 10 children to the late Jean Baptiste and Aglee (Martineau) Hebert. He moved to the United States and settled in Bloomfield, Vermont, in February 1947. His wife Lucienne (Tremblay) Hebert and son Yvon A. Hebert, who was killed in Vietnam, preceded him in death. He was a steward at the Stratford VFW Post, operated the Bloomfield Hotel bar and restaurant and worked for the New Hampshire Department of Transportation for 21 years. He served the Village of Bloomfield, Vermont, for 20 years as town constable & tax collector. He retired at the age of 80 so he could enjoy his recreational sports. Tony was an avid outdoorsman, hunter, fisherman and snowmobiler. He enjoyed cutting firewood and logs and continued cutting until he was 92.
