



## Arthur E. Jarrett

June 15, 1952 - January 16, 2021

PITTSBURG – Arthur E. Jarrett, 68, of Pittsburg, died at the Tufts University Hospital in Boston, Mass., on Saturday, Jan. 16, 2021, after a brief illness.

Born on June 15, 1952 in Stamford, Conn., he was a son of the late Arthur S. and Dorothy (Hanson) Jarrett.

Art was a long-time volunteer at Turn of River Fire Department in Stamford, and the local snowmobile club. After his retirement from the City of Stamford, he moved to Pittsburg. Art was an active member in many organizations here in the north country, including the Pittsburg Historical Society, the Ridge Runners Snowmobile Club, and the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES). His radio call sign was well known as KA1YVU. He was an avid garage and yard sale visitor and frequently attended amateur radio "hamfests" all over the country, where he made countless friends throughout the region. He used to say, "Sometimes, I can't remember everybody's name, but I've never forgotten the face of someone I've met."

Art is survived by his sister-in-law Penie Jarrett, and nieces Cindy Wettenstein, Christine Cocchia, and Cathy Linask, all from Connecticut, as well as many friends in Pittsburg. He was predeceased by his brothers, William R. Jarrett and Richard Jarrett.

There are no public calling hours. A graveside interment service will be held at a later date in the Lake Cemetery in Pittsburg, of which notice will be given.
