



Beatrice "Betty" E. Haynes

August 9, 1925 - May 1, 2013

COLEBROOK, NH— Mrs. Beatrice “Betty” E. Haynes, 87, of Colebrook, passed away on Wednesday morning, May 1, 2013, at the Coös County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown.

She was born in Stewartstown, NH, on August 9, 1925, a daughter to the late Raymond & Verna (Hall) Knapp. Betty attended the local schools in Stewartstown. She married in 1942 and made her home in Pittsburg for the next 17 years, and then the family moved to Magalloway, Maine, for nine years. Following that, they relocated to Colebrook where Betty had been a resident since 1968.

For many years, Betty worked in the school lunch programs in Pittsburg and Colebrook, and she also owned and operated her own homemade chocolate & candy shop on Main Street in Colebrook for many years. She was a collector of both Colebrook and Pittsburg souvenirs and memorabilia, as well as anything having to do with bluebirds, and her collections were extensive at one time. Betty also loved doing crafts and painting. She was also a wonderful gardener and homemaker for her family.

She is survived by three grandchildren, Warren L. Haynes of Columbia; Kerry Haynes and wife Kathleen, and Gia Gould and husband, Greg, all of Colebrook; 8 great-grandchildren; a brother, Marshall Knapp of Goshen, NH;

as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

Betty is predeceased by her husband, Warren "Pic" Haynes in 2003; a daughter, Shirley Elaine Haynes in 1946; a son, Leslie Ray Haynes in 1999; and a brother, Winston Knapp.

There are no public calling hours. A graveside service will be held on Saturday, May 4, 2013, at 11 a.m. at the Pittsburg Hollow Cemetery with The Rev. Paula Fletcher officiating.
