



Bernie E. Hicks, Sr.

May 4, 1928 - April 4, 2011

COLEBROOK, NH-- Mr. Bernie E. Hicks, Sr., 82, passed away Monday afternoon, April 4, 2011, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook, NH, after a long period of declining health and with his family at his side.

Bernie was born on May 4, 1928, in Colebrook, NH, a son to the late Bernie C. and Agnes (Drummond) Hicks. He served with honor in the U.S. Army in Germany after World War II. He married Lillian A. Clancy on May 16, 1948.

Bernie was a civil engineer for most of his life, and he worked for Epec Electronics in New Bedford, Mass., and then for Saunders Associates. After his retirement when he returned to his boyhood home, he was well known in town as the school crossing guard.

He also had many other interests and hobbies that included hunting and fishing, playing the guitar, stamp collecting, and volunteering with his wife at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital the local recreation center pool. He served as a cemetery trustee for the town of Colebrook for many years. Bernie was a member of the Mohawk Grange #217, and a lifetime member of the American Philatelic Society.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Lillian (Clancy) Hicks of Colebrook, NH;

his children, Bernie Sausser and Josephine Zimmerman of Augsburg, Germany; Deborah Brooks of West Stewartstown, NH; and Douglas Hicks and wife Patricia of Manchester, NH; a brother, Raymond Hicks and wife Gertrude, of Canaan, Vt.; fifteen grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

He is preceded in death by his parents; two sons, Bernie E. Hicks, Jr. in 1954; and Robert Hicks in 1998; and a brother, Ronald Hicks.

At Bernie's specific request, there are no calling hours. A graveside service will be held at the Colebrook Village Cemetery on his next birthday, Wednesday, May 4, 2011, at 11:00 a.m.
