



Beverly M. McDaniels

June 30, 1928 - May 13, 2024

CONCORD – Beverly M. McDaniels, 95, of Concord, died at the Havenwood Heritage Heights in Concord, N.H., on Monday, May 13, 2024, after a long period of declining health and where she had been a resident since 2006.

She was born in Colebrook on June 30, 1928, a daughter to the late Herbert and Ada (Keach) Marshall. Beverly was a 1945 graduate of Colebrook Academy and was the valedictorian of her class.

Following high school, Beverly attended Tufts College in Boston, graduating in 1949. She then worked at the N.Y. State Hospital in Middleton, N.Y., in the occupational therapy department. A few years after that, she took a leave to attend the Richmond Professional Institute and became a registered occupational therapist. In 1964, she moved to Colorado, attended the University of Denver, and earned a Master's degree in elementary education. She taught in the Denver school system for a period and relocated back to the east in 1969. She then worked in the Newburgh, N.Y., school system's new program for children with learning disabilities, retiring in 1991 after 22 years.

Beverly enjoyed traveling, mostly in the U.S., visiting cousins and friends in New England and throughout New York. She liked to read, watch TV, attending concerts, and dabbling in clay building, sculpture, and drawing. She was a long-time volunteer driver for the American Cancer Society, and also

delivered “Meals-On-Wheels” and did shopping for homebound neighbors.

She is survived by many cousins in the north country, but never had any children of her own.

At Beverly’s request, there are no public calling hours or services scheduled. Beverly will be privately laid to rest in the Marshall family lot in the Colebrook Village Cemetery.

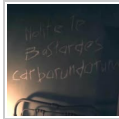
