



## Burley J. Hammond

March 8, 1928 - August 5, 2010

COLUMBIA, NH -- Mr. Burley J. Hammond, 82, of Columbia, NH, passed away early on Thursday, August 5, 2010, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook.

He was born in Upton, Me., on March 8, 1928, a son of A. Hammond and Mary (Lumbard) Hammond. Burley attended school in Colebrook.

In his working life, he helped to construct Murphy Dam on Lake Francis in Pittsburg, and he worked in the woods from 1946 until his retirement. He also resided in Connecticut for a period of years where he was a member of the Ellington, Conn., volunteer fire department. Burley was also a well-known carpenter and contractor, keeping busy even after his retirement.

He enjoyed hunting and fishing, and snowmobiling, and he was an avid coin collector.

He is survived by his daughter, Linda Shallow and husband David, of Columbia.

Mr. Hammond is preceded in death by his wife, Velna in 2006; by a sister, Clara Atherton; and a brother, Albert Hammond.
