January 25, 1937 - October 2, 2006

PITTSBURG, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Clayton M. "Soup" Campbell, 69, of Pittsburg, NH, died on Monday afternoon, October 2, 2006, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook, NH.
