PITTSBURG – Dianne S. McLaughlin, 74, of Pittsburg, passed away peacefully on Wednesday evening, April 29, 2020, at her home with her family by her side and after a long period of declining health.

Dianne is preceded in death by her father, Robert Skinner, and a sister, Marilyn Chase.

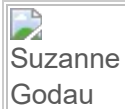
There will be no public calling hours. All other services will be private for the family.

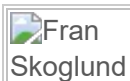
