PITTSBURG, NH – Mrs. Edwina “Winnie” M. Griffin, 102, of Pittsburg, NH, passed away on Thursday morning, May 7, 2009, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook, NH, with her loving family at her side.

She was born in Somerville, Mass., on December 30, 1906, one of two daughters to Edwin Bean and Adelle (Corey) Bean.

Winnie moved with her family from Massachusetts to Wilton, NH, in 1951, and she lived there until 1997 when she relocated to Pittsburg, NH, to live in the home of her son, Wayne.

nephews. Her blended family also includes three step-grandchildren, John Coleman of Missouri, Jane Barcomb of Vt., and Joseph Coleman of Lyndeborough, NH; ten step great-grandchildren; and ten step great-great grandchildren.

Mrs. Griffin is preceded in death by her husband, Theodore R. Griffin, in 1972; a son, Garth J. Griffin in 1997; and a sister, Nathalie Creed.
