



## Edwin "Dellie" M. Robie

March 24, 1926 - July 30, 2010

WEST STEWARTSTOWN, NH -- Mr. Edwin "Dellie" M. Robie, 84, of West Stewartstown, NH, passed away at his home early on Friday, July 30, 2010, after a period of failing health.

He was born on March 24, 1926, in Bloomfield, Vt. He married Wilma Hawes in 1950.

Dellie's working career started at Ethan Allen in the 1940s. During the 1950s, he and his wife owned and operated the Trading Post and the Woodland Dance Hall in Pittsburg for many years. In Pittsburg, he served as a town selectman, police chief, and fire chief. He later began to work as a woods road supervisor and foreman for St. Regis and he continued on when the company was purchased by Champion. Dellie retired from Champion in 1992.

He enjoyed fishing and bird hunting, attending school softball games, and playing softball himself, and he was an avid cribbage player. He also loved to ride the back roads of Pittsburg. Dellie cherished his family and loved to spend time with his grandchildren.

Dellie leaves behind his daughter, Allyson Robie of Penacook, NH; his stepson, Willard "Bob" Ormsbee of Pittsburg, NH; and his five grandchildren, Nathan Majewski of Epsom, NH, April Majewski of Ashburn, Va., Gregory

Majewski of Myrtle Beach, SC, Matthew and Taylor Ormsbee of Pittsburg, NH.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Wilma in 1991, his daughter Carolyn Majewski in 1982, and an infant son in 1956.

There are no calling hours. A graveside service at the Indian Stream Cemetery in Pittsburg, NH, will be held on Tuesday, August 3, 2010, at 1:00 p.m. with The Rev. Rick Boyden officiating.
