NORTH STRATFORD— Elizabeth M. Cote, 77, of North Stratford, passed away Monday evening, Feb. 20, 2017, at the Coos County Nursing Hospital in W. Stewartstown surrounded by members of her loving family.

She was born in Norton Mills, Vt., on June 22, 1939, a daughter to the late Dennis and Lorena (Potter) Gaudette.

A devoted wife, mother, grandmother and sister, Elizabeth was a nurse and worked for Genesis Healthcare in Lancaster prior to retiring.
