



## Elizabeth Hurlbert

STEWARTSTOWN, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Elizabeth Hurlbert, 84, of Stewartstown, NH, formerly of Nashua, NH, passed away early Thursday morning, December 6, 2007, at the Coos County Nursing Hospital.

Elizabeth was born July 22, 1923, in Clarksville, NH, daughter of the late Gerard E. and Myrtle (Comstock) Hurlbert.

Elizabeth attended school in Clarksville and graduated from Pittsburg High School. She worked for Plunkett & Webster Lumber Company and Royal Bolduc Lumber Company and in 1959, she moved to Boston where she began working for M.I.T. She continued her work with M.I.T. for 31 years and in 1990, she retired as an Administrative Assistant. She resided in Nashua until 2005 when she moved to Stewartstown to become a resident of the Coos County Nursing Hospital. She will be remembered for her love of travel, raising horses and dogs, and caring for her farmhouse in Clarksville.

Elizabeth is survived by numerous cousins, dear friends and a special friend, Claudette Wintle of Nashua, NH. She is preceded in death by her parents and her sister, Lenora Hurlbert.
