



Elizabeth "Betty" Weyrauch

February 7, 1917 - May 17, 2008

CAPE ELIZABETH, MAINE -- Mrs. Elizabeth "Betty" Weyrauch, 91, of Cape Elizabeth, Maine, passed away on Saturday, May 17, 2008, at the Barron Center in Portland, Maine, after a long period of declining health.

Betty was born on Wednesday, February 7, 1917, in Reading, Massachusetts. She attended schools in Massachusetts, and later married Walter Weyrauch. While her husband served in the U.S. Navy during World War II, Betty worked as a secretary for the airlines in Boston and later for a large insurance company. After the war, the Weyrauchs settled in Cape Elizabeth, Maine, where Betty became a real estate broker for the Spurwink Agency and later for the Weyrauch Agency.

While in her forties Betty developed a love of skiing, and she skied well into her eighties. After retiring from real estate, Betty spent her winters for nearly thirty years on the slopes of The BALSAMS Wilderness Ski Area while her husband taught skiing to thousands of resort guests. She made many friends at The BALSAMS and will be remembered for her contagious laugh, her brightly colored ski suits, and her graceful and recognizable style on the slopes. Betty was also an avid golfer and enjoyed traveling all over the country with her husband.

Betty leaves behind her husband, Mr. Walter Weyrauch of Cape Elizabeth,

Maine; a son, William Weyrauch, of Cape Elizabeth; and her very special friends who have been as close as family for more than 40 years, Ellie Pearson, Michael and Andy Pearson, all of Colebrook, NH, and Tamme Pearson of Hood River, Ore.; as well as nieces and nephews in southern California.

Betty is preceded in death by two brothers, George and Fred Morse.

At the request of the family, there are no calling hours. A graveside service will be held at a later date at the convenience of the family in the Pearson lot at the Round Top Cemetery in Dixville Notch, NH.
