



Elsie D. Noyes

September 25, 1928 - January 14, 2025

W. STEWARTSTOWN – Elsie D. Noyes, 96, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, Jan. 14, 2025, at the Coös County Nursing Hospital in W. Stewartstown with members of her family at her side.

She was born in Bloomfield, Vt., on Sept. 25, 1928, a daughter to the late Burton E. and Daisy M. (Fuller) Stevens. Elsie was a 1947 graduate of North Stratford High School.

Elsie worked at Ethan Allen in Beecher Falls for 12 years, but spent most of her adult life as a dedicated homemaker for her family. She loved to fish and hunt, especially bird hunting, getting the legal limit every year. She also loved to travel.

Elsie is survived by her six children, Thomas Lewis of Bellevue, Nebraska, David Noyes of Laconia, N.H., Alan Noyes of Claremont, N.H., Bradley Noyes of Lakeland, Fla., Ramona Cameron of Colebrook, and Debra Lewis of Tampa, Fla.; a sister, Elizabeth Mercer of Connecticut; 12 grandchildren, 21 great-grandchildren and 4 great-great grandchildren.

She is preceded in death by her husband of 63 years, Wilfred I. Noyes, in 2020, and a brother, Shirley Stevens.

There are no public calling hours. A graveside interment service will be held later in 2025 at the Indian Stream Cemetery in Pittsburg, of which notice will be given.

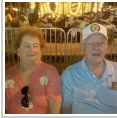
