



Eugene J. Beloin

December 27, 1918 - June 17, 2010

COLEBROOK, NH -- Mr. Eugene J. Beloin, 91, of Colebrook, NH, passed away at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook on Thursday evening, June 17, 2010, after a long period of declining health and with his family at his side.

Mr. Beloin was born December 27, 1918, in East Hereford, Québec, son of the late Emmaneul Beloin and Rosa (Adam) Beloin.

Eugene was a life-long woodsman and farmer. He grew up on a family farm in Hereford, and then had his own farm on Stevens Hill in Colebrook for thirty-four years. Logging and raising Christmas trees were his passion. He loved to be outdoors and was renowned for his hard work on the land.

Eugene loved his family deeply, and he was especially fond of children. He was a former member of the Knights of Columbus, and he was a communicant at St. Brendan's Catholic Church in Colebrook.
