



Frank "Hank" Lyman Tracy

ERROL, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Frank "Hank" Lyman Tracy, 76, of Errol, New Hampshire, passed away at his home in Errol on Friday, May 16, 2008, after a lengthy illness.

Frank was born in New Sharon, Maine, on August 23, 1931, a son of the late Harvey L. and Grace E. (Osborne) Tracy. He was married to Violet Lafountain of Maine and together raised a step-daughter and a son. Frank later married Brenda L. (Gilman) Tracy of Maine and together raised four children.

Frank served in the United States Army during the Korean Conflict, traveling overseas during his tour of duty. After his military service, Frank returned to the woods of Maine as a self-employed logger. Later he moved to New Hampshire and was employed by Currier Trucking as a tractor trailer driver, heavy equipment operator and mechanic. He retired after 35 years.

Frank was an avid sportsman who loved to hunt and fish. He enjoyed the great outdoors, gardening, beekeeping, boating, motorcycling and in his later years, birding. His other hobbies included watching and reading educational material, playing cards with his family and watching NASCAR (#24). Frank was a member of the American Legion, the Odd Fellows, and the NRA. He was blessed with a mechanical gift and was a creative woodworker. He especially loved spending time with his family and friends. Frank was known

for his big heart, easy going personality and quick wit. He will be forever loved and remembered.

Frank is survived by two sons, Dwight Tracy of Madison, ME, and James F. Tracy of Smyrna, DE; five daughters, Darleen Hewett of Maine, Lori (Langdon) Mosher and husband, Bill, of Fryeburg, ME, Raina L. Scarinza and husband, Jeffrey, of Randolph, NH, Candace L.
