



## Frederick B. Smith

May 18, 1936 - January 29, 2014

COLUMBIA, NH—Mr. Frederick “Fred” B. Smith, 77, of Columbia, joined his beloved wife, Margaret, in heaven on Wednesday evening, Jan. 29, 2014, after a long and hard-fought battle with cancer. All those who knew Fred can be sure he didn’t go without a brave fight.
