COLEBROOK, NH-- Mr. Frederick A. Strong, 79, of Colebrook, NH, passed away at the Weeks Medical Center in Lancaster, NH, on Monday afternoon, March 15, 2010.

He was born in Stoughton, Mass., on October 7, 1930, a son to Alfred Strong and Irene (Ballay) Strong.

He served with honor for four years in the U.S. Navy during the Korean conflict, and for 21 years in the National Guard, and Fred was proud of his military service.

For many years, Fred was a heavy equipment operator for his town in Massachusetts and for the Foundry before relocating to the North Country. Since moving north, he worked for Central Paving in Jefferson and for the Johnson Farm in Canaan, Vt. At his home near Maidstone, he enjoyed raising cattle. He was very active and could always be found exercising, running and walking. Fred loved to discuss politics and was always up to date on what was going on.

He was was a lifetime member of the American Legion Post 198 in Mansfield, Mass.

Mr. Strong leaves behind his partner of the last 21 years, Lucille King, of Colebrook, NH; a son, Glenn Strong of Plainville, Mass.; three daughters, Susan Schneider of Sharon, Mass., Gail Strong of South Attleboro, Mass., and Janice Strong of Hyannis, Mass.

He is preceded in death by his parents, and a brother.
