



Gordon Hurlbert

February 26, 1916 - December 19, 2007

COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Gordon Hurlbert, 91, of East Colebrook, New Hampshire, passed away early Wednesday morning, December 19, 2007, at the Weeks Medical Center in Lancaster, New Hampshire.

Mr. Hurlbert was born February 26, 1916, in Clarksville, NH, son of the late John and Rita (Pearson) Hurlbert, Sr.

During World War II, Mr. Hurlbert was employed at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard and in 1948, he left Portsmouth and moved to Harvey Swell Road in East Colebrook where he purchased the family farm. He was a man who loved his farm and land and all that grew on it, and he will be remembered as a true steward of the land. His other interests included hunting and fishing and he was a member of the Mohawk Grange, served as a deacon of the Kidderville Church and later was a member of the Monadnock Congregational Church.

Mr. Hurlbert is survived by his loving wife, Helena (Harding) Hurlbert of West Stewartstown, NH; his son, Guy Hurlbert and wife, Dale, of Colebrook; his daughter, Sharon Daugherty and husband, Duffy, of East Colebrook; five grandchildren; ten great-grandchildren; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

Mr. Hurlbert is preceded in death by his parents; his son, John Hurlbert in 2004; two brothers; and two sisters.

At Mr. Hurlbert's request, there will be no calling hours. A memorial service will be conducted at a later date.
