



Helena H. Hurlbert

August 13, 1921 - October 24, 2011

WEST STEWARTSTOWN, NH—Mrs. Helena (Harding) Hurlbert, 90, passed away on Monday afternoon, October 24, 2011, at the Coos County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown, with her family by her side, and after a long period of declining health.

She was born in in Columbia, NH, on August 13, 1921, and was educated in the local schools.

Helena's life was spent as a homemaker and mother to her family, and she and her husband ran the family farm in East Colebrook. She also worked as a waitress for a time at the Legion restaurant and also at The Balsams. For many years, she also worked for Stickney's Drug Store in town, and continued to work there for Irving Hughes when he purchased it. Helena was an active member of the Monadnock Congregational Church in Colebrook, and also attended church in Kidderville when services were held there. She was a member of the Mohawk Grange, #217, and she enjoyed gardening, her flowers, quilting and square-dancing, as well as attending and participating in her family's school functions. She will be remembered by all her family as a loving mother and grandmother, and she will be missed by all.

She leaves behind her son, Guy Hurlbert and wife Dale of Colebrook, NH; a daughter, Sharon Daugherty and husband Duffy of East Colebrook; five

grandchildren; and twelve great-grandchildren; as well as many nieces, nephews and cousins.

She is preceded in death by her husband, Gordon Hurlbert in 2007; a son, John R. Hurlbert in 2004; and her mother, Ida Gould.

There will be no public calling hours. A private graveside service will be held at the Stewartstown Hollow Cemetery.
