LANCASTER, NH—Mr. Henry J. Morrison, 88, of Lancaster, NH, and formerly of Dover, NH, passed away Monday evening, June 24, 2013, at the Country Village Healthcare Center in Lancaster after a long period of declining health.

He was born in Dover, NH, on March 13, 1925, a son to the late Hilray and Rita (Mulligan) Morrison and was raised in Dover. Following school, Henry served with honor in the U.S. Navy during World War II in the Pacific theater of the war. One of his jobs during that time was transporting Japanese prisoners-of-war.

After his military service, he returned to Dover and spent most of his life there. He was known as a hard worker, whether it be working on the railroad in the seacoast area or as a boiler technician for the Sawyer Mills.

He is survived by a daughter, Debra Phelan of Lancaster, NH; two sisters, Irene Andrews of Dover and Elizabeth Talon of Rochester, NH; three grandchildren, Allison Hern and husband Kevin, Erica Phelan, and Lynne Pelletier; and three great-grandchildren.
