PITTSBURG, NEW HAMPSHIRE ? Mr. Ivan G. Young, 80, of Pittsburg, New Hampshire, passed away early Wednesday morning, January 16, 2008, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital.

Mr. Young was born August 23, 1927, in Pittsburg, son of the late Stanley and Alma (Gardner) Young.

Mr. Young attended Danforth School in Pittsburg. He took numerous jobs as a young man working on area farms, including his grandfather's farm, working in the woods and on machinery. He was employed by the State of New Hampshire Highway Department for 32 years running heavy equipment and being responsible for keeping the road open from Pittsburg to the Canadian border. At the age of 62 he retired from the Highway Department and worked part-time running heavy equipment for area construction companies.

A devoted husband and father, he enjoyed spending time with his family and with his many friends. He was generous with his time, helping neighbors in need and always available to share a story or tell a joke. He loved ?holding court? every morning at Young's Store, sharing the daily news with friends and voicing his opinion. His other interests included gardening, snowmobiling, fishing, and bird hunting

Mr. Young is survived by four daughters, Tami Young of Pittsburg; Marlene Tardif and husband, Albert, of Pembroke, NH, Susan Bettis and husband, George, of Hartford, VT, and Lynn Dysart and husband, John, of Brunswick, ME; two grandchildren, Natalie Judge of Pembroke, NH, and Stephen Tardif of Epsom, NH; three great-grandchildren, Brooke Judge, Dakota Judge and Dylan Tardif; and an aunt, Ethel Jones of Canaan, VT.

Mr. Young is preceded in death by his parents and his loving wife, Helen Young.
