COLEBROOK – Lucille M. Largesse, 84, of Colebrook and formerly of Upton, Me., passed away on Saturday, Feb. 24, 2024, at the Country Village Healthcare Center in Lancaster, N.H., after a long period of declining health and battle with dementia.
