



Lurlyne E. Lambert

December 19, 1917 - April 6, 2011

WEST STEWARTSTOWN, NH – Lurlyne E. Lambert, 93, passed away on Wednesday evening, April 6, 2011, at the Coös County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown, NH, after a period of declining health, and with her family by her side.

She was born at Happy Corners in Pittsburg, NH, on December 19, 1917, a daughter to the late James and Lizzie (Day) Shallow. She attended the Danforth School in Pittsburg which was a combined class for grades 1-8, and then attended Pittsburg High School, graduating in the Class of 1936.

After graduation, she went to work for the Russell Sporting Camps in Pittsburg for 3 years. In 1945, she started working for the Idlewild Sporting Lodge and Camps on the Second Connecticut Lake and worked there until 1952. She was married to Donald Lambert in 1953 and then was a homemaker until the death of her husband in 1972. Following his death, she returned to work as a housekeeper for The Glen until she retired in 1997.

Lurlyne was a very independent woman, of the “old school,” living and taking care of her home and family alone as best as she could. Her niece, Muriel Dobson, and other friends assisted when she needed it.

She leaves behind her son, Parker Lambert and wife Judy, of Toledo, Ohio; two grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and her nieces and nephews.

Calling hours will be private for the family. A committal service and interment will be at the Pittsburg Hollow Cemetery later in the spring.
