



Marie Rose DeBanville

December 19, 1922 - April 9, 2012

BLOOMFIELD, VT—Mrs. Marie Rose DeBanville, 89, of Bloomfield, Vt., passed away on Monday afternoon, April 9, 2012, at the Coös County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown, NH.

She was born on December 19, 1922, in St. Isidore, Quebec, a daughter to the late Louis and Elise (Fecteau) Dostie. Rose grew up and attended schools in Canada and became a naturalized U.S. citizen in 1968.

Rose married Anthony “Junior” DeBanville in 1964, and they made their home and career in Bloomfield. Together, the couple owned and operated DeBanville’s General Store there for many years, until they both retired and sold the business in 2000. Rose will be long remembered for being in the store every day, doing all the jobs required. After retirement, she took very good care of her husband and remained in the family home until failing health prevented them from living there.

She is survived by a son, Yvon Gagne of British Columbia; two sisters in Canada; and numerous nieces and nephews. Rose is preceded in death by her husband in 2011, as well as three brothers and four sisters.

There will be no public calling hours. A memorial service will be held on Friday, April 20, 2012, at 11 a.m. at the Jenkins & Newman Funeral Home in

Colebrook. A private interment service will be held at a later date in the St. Stanislaus Cemetery in Bloomfield.
