NORTH STRATFORD, NH — Marjorie H. Caron, 69, of North Stratford, passed away early Thursday morning, Oct. 30, 2014, at home.

She was born in Columbia on July 8, 1945, a daughter to Bernard and Josephine (Grant) Harding. She attended the local schools and graduated from Stratford High School in 1962. She then attended Franklin Pierce Business College.

Marjorie spent her early years raising her family. At a professional level for many years, she was also a CNA and a well-known local caregiver for her friends and neighbors. Marjorie was a very active member of the First Baptist Church and her faith was important to her.
