NORTH STRATFORD, NH -- Mrs. Marjorie Mills Carrier, 87, of North Stratford, NH, passed away in the early afternoon of Friday, December 18, 2009, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook, NH.

Marjorie was born in Brunswick, Vt., on February 20, 1922, a daughter of John L. Mills and Blanche (Spencer) Mills.

In 1944 she married Norman B. Carrier, and they raised their family in the local area of North Stratford and Brunswick, Vt. She worked for 23 years as a telephone operator for the local phone company, and served as a union representative, and for 31 years she was the librarian for the Town of North Stratford. Marjorie was very involved in numerous civic organizations over the years, including the Bicentennial commission, local blood banks, the Brunswick school board, cemetery associations and many more. She loved to give of her time. She was also an avid seamstress, and was known for her quilting. Marjorie was also a member of the Pythian Sisters.
