



## Myrtle A. Collins

BELMONT, NH—Mrs. Myrtle A. Collins, 89, of Belmont and formerly of Colebrook, NH, passed away on Thursday afternoon, April 12, 2012, at the St. Francis Nursing Home in Laconia, NH, after a long period of failing health.
