



Nancy Moulton

August 7, 1936 - July 4, 2015

BRUNSWICK, VT – Nancy C. Moulton, 78, of Brunswick, Vt., died peacefully late on Saturday evening, July 4, 2015, at the Weeks Medical Center in Lancaster with her daughters by her side.

She was born in Brighton, Vt., on August 7, 1936, the only daughter of the late Clarence and Celia (Perry) Curtis, Sr. She was raised and educated in Brighton, and later married Richard “Dick” Moulton. They soon relocated to North Stratford in 1954, and finally settled just over the river in Brunswick.

A well-known figure in and around Brunswick, Bloomfield, and North Stratford, Nancy was a local housekeeper for many. She was an avid fan of all the Stratford sports for many years, and was honored with the title of “Fan of the Year” in 2009. She was always cooking for a church supper or some other event, and her friends and family will always miss her famous mile-high chocolate pie. Nancy’s favorite saying was “Jiminy Cricket!” and she never tired of watching the movie “Top Gun” or the “Dukes of Hazzard.” She cherished her family and grandchildren, and loved all holidays and time spent with them. Nancy was a faithful member of the 1st Baptist Church in North Stratford for many years.

Nancy is survived by her two daughters, Diana Ramsay and husband Tim of Brunswick, Vt., and Darlene Hopkins and husband Michael of Littleton, NH; four grandchildren, Renee, T.J. and Brittany Ramsay, and Kalissa Hopkins; and six great-grandchildren.

She is predeceased by her loving husband of 51 years, Richard Moulton in 2005; a young son, Ricky Moulton in 1957; and two brothers, Clarence Curtis, Jr., and Ronald Curtis.
