ORLANDO, FL –Nanette Lucille Brunault McClelland, 60, of Colebrook, NH, passed away on Monday, February 28, 2011, at Florida Orlando Hospital in Orlando, Fl., after a short illness.

She was born in West Stewartstown, NH, on September 15, 1950, a daughter to Paul and Isabelle (Hebert) Brunault. The oldest of seven children, Nanette graduated from Colebrook Academy in 1968 and then attended the University of New Hampshire in Durham, graduating in 1972 with a degree in history. She went on to teach in Nashua, NH, and Pittsburg, NH.

Nanette married Captain James McClelland III and moved to Grove City, Penn., where she then worked as a pharmaceutical representative for 17 years before retiring in 2001. She was a member of the Grove City Area Historical Society, and she was active in local charities. Nanette will be best remembered for her generosity to others and the love she shared with her nieces and nephews. In Sept. 2010, Nanette moved back to her childhood home of Colebrook to be with her family.

Ms. McClelland leaves behind her mother, Isabelle Brunault of Colebrook; her sister, Denise Webb and husband Bill of Ft. Myers, Fl.; her brothers, John Brunault and David Brunault and wife Julie of Colebrook; her sisters Renay Russin of Bristol, NH, Luann Farley and husband Jonathan of Scarborough,

Me., and Paula Brunault of Manchester, NH; as well as her nieces and nephews, José and Robert Brunault, Ashley and Brandon Webb, Cassandra Russin, and Daniel Farley.

She is preceded in death by her father, Paul Brunault.

There are no public calling hours or services at this time. A committal service and interment will be held in the spring at St. Brendan's Cemetery in Colebrook.
