WEST STEWARTSTOWN – Nina B. Raymond, 90, of West Stewartstown, passed away on Thursday, Nov. 29, 2017, at the Coös County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown where she had resided for the past year.

Nina was born in West Stewartstown on July 24, 1927, a daughter to Samuel and Mable (Condon) Marsh, Sr., and was raised in Pittsburg. She was a graduate of Pittsburg High School.

Although Nina worked for a short time as a factory laborer at the Brown Co. and later Stratford Plywood Mill, for most of her life she was a dedicated homemaker to her family. She was very active for many years at her church, the 1st Baptist, and she was a very social person. She loved to be around people and never had a bad word about anyone. She loved to play Bingo, attend Stratford's Fantastic Friday celebrations each week, attend the local fairs each year, and she loved music, especially country & western.

Nina is survived by her three children, Harvey 'Slugger' Raymond, Jr. and his wife Kathi of Colebrook, David Raymond and wife Linda of Bloomfield, and Charlotte Sweatt of Danbury, NH; her dear friend who was as close to her as a daughter, Charlotte Robinson of North Stratford; a sister, Ruth Brooks of Colebrook; nine grandchildren and 20 great-grandchildren; as well as numerous nieces and nephews.

A funeral will be held at 11 a.m. on Monday, Dec. 4, at the 1st Baptist Church in North Stratford.
