



Norman G. Rancloes

July 31, 1931 - June 20, 2011

PITTSBURG, NH-- Mr. Norman George Rancloes, 79, passed away unexpectedly on Monday morning, June 20, 2011, at the home of his caretaker, Mishawn Hann, in Pittsburg.

He was born in Canaan, Vt., on July 31, 1931, a son to the late Francis George and Lottie (Young) Rancloes. He attended local schools in Clarksville and Pittsburg.

Norman worked for several years at the Ethan Allen furniture factory in Beecher Falls, Vt., before entering the U.S. Army on Jan. 22, 1952. He was in the 591st Medical Co. Ambulance in Toul, France, and was honorably discharged in May of 1960.

He returned to his home in Pittsburg and resumed his work at Ethan Allen. Later he went to work for the State of NH Dept. of Transportation on one of the local highway crews, and he retired from that position in 1994. Norman enjoyed the outdoors and loved to go fishing, owning and selling several small boats. He also enjoyed his yard sale, and met many nice people over the years.

He was a Gold Circle member of the VFW Post 5243 in North Stratford, and was a member of the American Legion Post 47 in Canaan, Vt.

Family members include his brother, Frank Rancloes and wife Glenna of Stewartstown, NH; ten nieces and nephews; numerous grand-nieces and grand-nephews; and several cousins.

There are no public calling hours. A committal service with military honors will be held on Friday, July 1, 2011, at 11 a.m. at the Pittsburg Hollow Cemetery. A reception for friends and family will follow at the home of Norman's niece, Wanda (Robert) Brown in Stewartstown.
