Pauline Joos, 62, of Stewartstown died December 28, 2010 at the home of her son in Colebrook.

She was born in Laconia, NH on April 27, 1948, the only daughter of Paul and Mary Prince.

Following school in Laconia, she attended Nazareth College of Rochester NY, graduating with a Bachelors Degree in Speech Pathology in 1970.

Upon returning to Laconia and starting her professional career she met Dennis Joos. Realizing that a life below the Notches was not what they wanted, they searched northern New Hampshire for a place to settle, finally deciding on a parcel of land high on South Hill in Stewartstown. She and Dennis were married there in June 1973 and spent the year building a small stone house. She worked as a speech and language pathologist in area schools, having a profound impact on many young lives. She returned to Nazareth College and received a Masters Degree in Speech Pathology in 1992.

meticulous gardens; in death she will remain forever keeper of the flowers.

She is survived by her son Aaron and his wife Oxana. She was predeceased by her husband Dennis in 1997.
