WEST STEWARTSTOWN, NEW HAMPSHIRE -- Mr. Richard C. Berry, 66, of Mill Street, West Stewartstown, New Hampshire, passed away early Monday morning, May 19, 2008, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital.

Mr. Berry was born December 7, 1941, in Clarksville, NH, a son of the late Arthur and Lena (Wheeler) Berry.

Mr. Berry served honorably in the United States Army from 1964-66. He worked as an auto technician at Brooks Chevrolet for over 20 years, and later worked in the maintenance department at Beecher Falls Division of Ethan Allen for 20 years, retiring in 2005 at the age of 64. He volunteered his time by driving for the R.C.T. in St. Johnsbury, VT, and by serving as sexton of the Stewartstown Hollow Cemetery. His many interests included fishing, partridge hunting and snowmobiling. He will be remembered for his sense of humor and his willingness to help a friend or family member in need.

Mr. Berry is survived by his loving wife, Gloria O'Keefe of West Stewartstown, NH; two sons, Jason Berry of Gorham, NH, and Cory Berry of New Brunswick, ME; a step-son, Shane O'Keefe and wife, Jayne, of Manchester, NH; a step-daughter, Angela Cook and husband, Ken, of Orleans, VT; a brother, Randy Berry of Wallace Pond, VT; five step-grandchildren, Eric O'Keefe, Jeremy O'Keefe, Star O'Keefe, Toma O'Keefe and J.T. O'Keefe; a step-great-

grandson, Jaron O'Keefe; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

Mr. Berry is preceded in death by his parents; a step-son, Jason O'Keefe; and two brothers, Arthur Berry and Basil Berry.

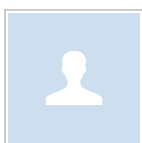
