



Richard E. Loiselle

December 26, 1922 - December 18, 2009

CASTLE ROCK, CO – Mr. Richard E. Loiselle, 86, of Castle Rock, Colo., and formerly of Pittsburg, NH and New Jersey, passed away early Friday morning, December 18, 2009, in Castle Rock.

Richard was born in Concord, NH, on December 26, 1922, a son of the late Clyde B. Loiselle and Frances (Prescott) Loiselle. He graduated from Concord High School in 1940.

He served with honor in the U.S. Army from 1942-45 in the European theater during World War II, and was wounded in the Italian & Sicilian Campaign in 1944, for which he earned the Purple Heart. Following his service, he began a long career as an electronic technician for many different companies. He worked longest in the research and development field as a civilian for the U.S. Army, spending 30 years at Fort Monmouth, NJ. Following his retirement, he enjoyed living in Florida and Pittsburg, NH.

Richard liked to fish and bird hunt, and he was a ham radio operator from his home. He also loved to play golf and played each morning. He was a member of the Disabled American Veterans of Lake Worth, Fla., the American Legion Northland Post #47 in Canaan, Vt., and a member of the 46th Infantry Division Association, 3rd Battalion of the 120th Engineers.

Mr. Loiselle is survived by a son, James Loiselle of Castle Rock, Colo.; a daughter, Susan Farmer, of Fort Worth, Tex.; six grandchildren; as well as nieces and nephews.

He is preceded in death by his wife, Janet (Archibald) Loiselle; and a son, Richard W. Loiselle in 2008.

At his specific request there are no services. A committal service with military honors will take place at the New Hampshire State Veterans' Cemetery on Route 3 in Boscawen, NH, on Friday, January 15, 2010, at 2:00 p.m.
