COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Richard W. Loiselle, 62, of Colebrook, New Hampshire, formerly of Columbia, New Hampshire, passed away Monday evening, July 14, 2008, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital surrounded by his family and friends.

Richard was born February 23, 1946, in Concord, NH, a son of Richard E. and Janet B. (Archibald) Loiselle.

Richard was raised in New Jersey and as a young man owned a mail order business for wholesale electrical supplies. He enlisted in the United States Air Force and upon his honorable discharge from active duty, he served as a reservist in the Air Force Reserve. In 1973, he owned and operated Archibald Insurance Agency in Raymond, NH, and in 1986, he moved to Columbia where he worked for The BALSAMS Grand Resort Hotel, for A.D. Davis, and for Karlene Grover. In May 2001, he established Columbia Hills Gifts, Baskets & More and later sold the business in 2007 and moved to Colebrook. His passion was cooking, entertaining and traveling, but his greatest joy was spending time with his family and his countless friends.

Richard is survived by his companion, Harry Olmstead of Colebrook; his father, Richard E. Loiselle of Castle Rock, CO; his brother, Jim Loiselle of Castle Rock, CO; his sister, Susan Farmer of Fort Worth, TX; and his many

friends.

Richard is preceded in death by his mother, Janet B. (Archibald) Loiselle, and a very special friend, Robert King.
