



## Rodney H. Bacon

February 15, 1920 - May 24, 2009

STEWARTSTOWN, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Rodney H. Bacon, 89, of Stewartstown, New Hampshire, passed away Sunday afternoon, May 24, 2009, at his home with his loving family at his side.

Rodney was born February 15, 1920, in Beecher Falls, VT, a son of George Andrew and Myrtle (Giverson) Bacon.

Rodney served with the 88th Infantry Division “Blue Devils” during World War II, landing in North Africa and participating in battles on the push to Rome. Following his honorable discharge, he returned home and married Leatrice Haynes with whom he recently observed their 62nd wedding anniversary. He retired after 20 years of service with the General Services Administration at the Beecher Falls, VT, Customs and Immigration Station. His retirement years were spent at their farm on Bishop Brook Road and in St. Cloud, Florida. He enjoyed hunting, fishing and gardening. He also took special pride in his beautiful flowers.

Rodney is survived by his loving wife, Leatrice Bacon of Stewartstown, NH; two sons, Dr. Douglas Bacon and wife, Laurence, of Stewartstown, NH, and David Bacon and companion, Gerald Garley, of Ninole, HI; two daughters, Eileen Kershner and husband, Colonel Ronald Kershner, of Kaneohe, HI, and Marjorie Hilaman and fiancé, Jay Summitt, of Thomasville, GA; seven grandchildren; six great-grandchildren; one sister-in-law, Martha Pratt of Canaan, VT; and numerous nieces and nephews.

Rodney is preceded in death by his parents and his brother, Carl Crawford.
