ERROL, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Ronald “R.J.” Broad, 57, of Dam Road, Errol, New Hampshire, passed away early Friday morning, April 11, 2008, at the Genesis Eldercare in Lebanon, New Hampshire.

R.J. was born October 2, 1950, in Bridgeport, CT, a son of Robert and Delores (Mitchell) Broad.

R.J. attended special classes in Bridgeport and Derby, CT, and worked in the shelter workshop at the original Kennedy Center for the mentally disabled. He later worked in the shelter workshop at the Value Association for Retarded Children and Adults in Shelton, CT, while also helping in the family business. He moved to New Hampshire with his family in 1977 where he worked at Brown Owl Camps for his parents. He loved the outdoors, enjoying hunting, fishing and snowmobiling. He was a member of the Umbagog Snowmobile Association and a past member of the Boy Scouts.

R.J. is survived by his father, Robert Broad of Errol, NH; four brothers, Allan Broad of Haines City, FL, Louis Broad of Londonderry, NH, David Broad of Manchester, NH, and Ralph Broad of Errol, NH; his aunt, Florence Imery of Bridgeport, CT; three nephews, Cameron, Brandon and Duncan Broad; and a niece, C.D. Broad.

R.J. is preceded in death by his mother, Delores (Mitchell) Broad, and a brother, Robert Broad.
