



Stephen K. Brungot

October 9, 1947 - March 19, 2016

COLEBROOK, NH — Mr. Stephen K. Brungot, 68, of Colebrook, passed away late Saturday evening, March 19, 2016, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook, after being stricken at his home and after a long period of poor health.

He was born on Oct. 9, 1947, in West Stewartstown, a son to the late Norman and Lois A. (Clawson) Brungot. Steve was a 1965 graduate of Colebrook Academy. He attended NH College in Manchester for a period of time, but was drafted into the U.S. Army during the Vietnam era.

Steve's military career lasted 22 years, with duty stations in South Korea (where he met his wife), as well as Japan, Thailand, and Germany. He retired from the Army at the rank of Master Sergeant, and received two purple heart ribbons among many other decorations. Upon returning home to the north country, Steve worked for a time as a police dispatcher and also in the accounting department at The Balsams before being hired by U.S. Customs & Immigration as an agent on the border. Steve's second career, in law enforcement, lasted 19 years.

Steve was an excellent bowler, and was crowned state champion in his younger years. He was active in civic and fraternal organizations in his community, and served on the Colebrook Planning Board. He was a Master

Mason and member of Evening Star Lodge #37, F. & A.M., and the George L. O'Neil post of the American Legion. He loved to visit with friends over breakfast at the Wilderness Restaurant, and he usually stuck to his daily routine, just loving life.

Steve is survived by his wife of almost 40 years, Chong (Chang) Brungot of Colebrook; his daughter, Shanna Caron and husband Shane of Henniker, NH; his son Craig Brungot and wife Melissa of Manchester, NH; two brothers, Randall Brungot and wife Michelle of Wolfeboro, NH, and Eric Brungot of Concord, NH; a sister, Jane Boudart and husband Louis of Bear, Del.; and one grandchild.

He is preceded in death by a brother, Norman Brungot, Jr.

Calling hours will be on Thursday, March 24, 2016, from 5 to 8 p.m. at the Jenkins & Newman Funeral Home in Colebrook, with the Masonic Burial Rite to be held at 4:45. A graveside committal with military honors will be later in the spring in the Colebrook Village Cemetery of which notice will be given.

“ I am saddened by the loss of my closest friend during the 1980's while in the U.S. Army at Fort Devens, MA, and at Nelligen Barracks, Germany. Steve was first my boss at Fort Devens in 1982. Our families became close friends, with children about the same age. We had dinners together, played cards and board games, and often bowled together. Later, in 1986, after I was commissioned, I ended up being Steve's boss at Nelligen, Germany. Steve once again was my closest friend. Our families became even closer friends then. Cha often took care of my children, Steve and I followed the Red Sox to a pennant win in 1986, only to witness the heartbreaking World Series loss together on my TV at about 3 a.m. We also bowled together on league teams and company teams in tournaments. We shared many special moments in Germany - field training exercises, volksmarching, playing board games, watching sports, drinking German beer, and of course, bowling.

In the 1990's, after Steve's military retirement, I would visit Steve occasionally in Colebrook. He and Cha were always gracious hosts - feeding us and showing us around the town, moose watching, pistol shooting, greeting friends and family, and just hanging out, enjoying good conversation and catching up on old memories.

Steve, my dear friend, I will see you in heaven some day. Rest in peace, soldier. Your mission on earth is now finished. May God rest your soul and may he bless Cha, Shanna and Craig.
