



Thomas L. Cross

December 28, 1949 - December 4, 2013

CANAAN, VT — Mr. Thomas L. Cross, 63, of Canaan, Vt., passed away early Wednesday morning, Dec. 4, 2013, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook, following a lengthy illness.

He was born on Dec. 28, 1949, in West Stewartstown, a son to the late Stephen B. and Lucinda E. Cross. Tom was a 1968 graduate of Colebrook Academy.

For many years, Tom worked for the Tillotson Rubber Co. in Dixville as a foreman, and most recently as the housekeeping supervisor for many different hospitals. His last place of employment was at UCVH in Colebrook.

Tom will be remembered for his great sense of humor and keen wit. He enjoyed driving around and visiting with the local farmers and business owners. He was especially proud of his children and grandchildren.
