COLEBROOK, NEW HAMPSHIRE – Mr. Victor L. “Leo” Morin, 78, of Colebrook, New Hampshire, and formerly of Chartierville, Québec, passed away Friday afternoon, March 21, 2008, at the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital in Colebrook.
