



## Virginia "Gige" Lay

January 19, 1916 - September 22, 2010

COLEBROOK, NH --Virginia "Gige" (Hughes) Lay, 94, of West Stewartstown, New Hampshire, formerly of Lemington, Vermont, passed away Wednesday, September 22, 2010, at the Coos County Nursing Hospital in West Stewartstown.

Gige was born January 19, 1916, in Colebrook, New Hampshire, on the family farm on Hughes Road, a daughter of the late Thomas and Marion (Hartshorn) Hughes.

A graduate of Colebrook Academy, she worked a number of years as a store clerk for Hill's Department Store in Colebrook. Her many interests included her association with the Hardy Girls, an all female snowmobile club; making Christmas stockings for her children and grandchildren; knitting hats and mittens for her family and friends; spending time at her family's camp at Diamond Pond; traveling; and doing cross-word puzzles. She especially enjoyed her friendship with Mimi who cared for her tenderly in her later years.

Gige is survived by her son, Richard Lay and wife, Faye, of Lemington; her daughter, Linda Masewic of Manchester, NH; a step-son, Bruce Hawes of Colebrook; nine grandchildren; fourteen great-grandchildren; two great-great grandchildren; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins.

She is preceded in death by her parents; her loving husband, Benjamin Lay in 1991; nine brothers; and three sisters.

At her family's request, there will be no calling hours. A graveside service will be conducted on Saturday, September 25, 2010, at 11:30 a.m. at the Colebrook Village Cemetery with The Reverend Marlyn Neary officiating.
